She shared poems from Rachel Korazim 's (Israeli Jewish educator and poet) class emphasizing threads that tie Israel together (and sometimes create rifts), including Hamutal bar Yosef's "identity Class" and Yehuda Amichai's "My Parents' Immigration"
Approve minutes from two meetings (Regular June and the Special June Meeting	MOTION to accept. Board approves passed unanimously.
Clergy ,ED, President, i25	Rabbi Amy indicated that Jody Arrant, the Rabbi's new (on-line) assistant, will be joining us at our meeting. (2) The High Holidays have begun to loom large; the Rabbi, Cantor, and Nat are very busy, leaving limited bandwith for other activities – please be patient! Cantor Steve announced that he has returned to his office! He's enjoying seeing everyone and watching the technology team work preparing for the Holidays. He reminded everyone of the upcoming Friday night services (at the Kornstein's house) and Saturday services at OZ. He concluded by expressing thanks to Sarah for all she's done (this is her last meeting). Sarah Glassman is on vacation in Acadia. (1) Much is happening around the membership pledge process (using the portal). There are snags. Andie is working on it this week; Sarah will be working for her final two weeks afterward. (2) Technology continues to arrive and Dan Rome and Rich Berger have been busy. Josh expressed appreciation for Sarah's work over the past two years, which have been extremely difficult.
Questions about written reports (Treasurer's is separate document)	Yoram inquired about Nat's first point, with regard to Andie's work and/or Sarah's replacement. Nat is looking at short term options for August (volunteers, other staff. We will need to look at hiring options in Executive Session (possibly separating administrative versus other responsibilities). Yoram recommended that other members of the Board step forward to assist Nat. Nat expressed appreciation. Naomi asked if Tari might be willing to step in to help. Brett asked about the fence built around the outdoor staircase next to the back entry. Sarah described a child having fallen down the outside staircase. Raul has arranged for reinforcement of the fence. Brett

inquired about policy for notifying the Board (at what threshold) of an "incident report." Cantor Steve indicated that he and Rabbi Amy were notified after the event occurred. Erika described how lucky the child was in not being severely injured. Erika notified the Preschool families and Raul acted immediately. Josh agreed with Brett that we need a formal policy (consistent with what we're working on following the pews removal) relative to a threshold event as the Board has both authority and liability/responsibility. Erika did not have to report the event to the state as the child was in the parent's care. She is happy to work with the Board moving forward. Rabbi Amy agreed that communications are critical. She suggested that events occurring at OZ where someone requires hospital attention should be sent in a 1-sentence notification to the Board. Mindy cited her ignorance over the pew event as another example where the Board should be notified.

Brett recommended that he and Josh work on a policy proposal.

Naomi noted that there is a difference between information and liability. Nat recommended we work on a "threshold" where the Board needs to be notified.

Eric noted an error in the formula sent out with the pledge sheets.

Sarah indicated we have no steps for hourly wage employees; she suggested to the HR committee they consider this. This may also include salaried employees to make it more equitable. Josh reiterated that, while we can't afford anything, employees should
